Mission

To aware the rural urban people about their basic human rights and develop human resources for understanding community planning and implementation for sustainability and equitable development in all respect. To work in solidarity with the poor and participate in their struggles to eradicate poverty, patriarchy and injustice.

Objectives

- 1. Raise Awareness:** Conduct awareness campaigns and educational programs to inform rural and urban communities about their basic human rights, ensuring they understand their entitlements and can exercise them effectively.
- 2. Human Resource Development:** Implement training and capacity-building initiatives to empower individuals within the community, equipping them with the skills and knowledge needed for community planning and sustainable development.
- 3. Community Planning:** Facilitate participatory community planning processes, involving local residents in decision-making and development initiatives that address their specific needs, thereby promoting sustainable and equitable development.
- 4. Sustainable Development:** Advocate and promote environmentally sustainable practices, encouraging communities to adopt eco-friendly approaches to development and resource utilization.
- 5. Equity and Social Justice:** Work towards creating a society that is free from exploitation, discrimination, and social inequalities. Advocate for equal opportunities and rights for all individuals, irrespective of their background or community.
- 6. Peace and Justice:** Promote peacebuilding and conflict resolution initiatives within communities, fostering a culture of dialogue, tolerance, and social harmony. Advocate for access to justice for marginalized groups and individuals.
- 7. Prosperity and Livelihoods:** Support economic empowerment by providing skills training, livelihood opportunities, and entrepreneurship development programs, aiming to enhance the prosperity and well-being of individuals and communities.
- 8. Collaboration and Partnerships:** Foster collaborations with government agencies, civil society organizations, and other stakeholders to amplify the impact of interventions and create a network for shared learning and resources.
- 9. Monitoring and Evaluation:** Establish robust monitoring and evaluation mechanisms to assess the effectiveness and impact of the organization's interventions, ensuring accountability and evidence-based decision-making.
- 10. Policy Advocacy:** Engage in advocacy efforts to influence policies and regulations that promote human rights, sustainable development, and social justice at local, regional, and national levels.

6. Projects and Programmes

A. Cohesive Development of Children & Youth (CDCY)

Implemented in Hooghly, this flagship project impacted **846 unique youth** and included:

- **Leadership & Life Skills Training:** Boosted teamwork, confidence, and public speaking in 183 youth
- **Communicative English:** 222 youth trained in spoken English, improving academic and career readiness
- **ARSH Training:** 152 adolescents sensitized on reproductive health, hygiene, and emotional well-being
- **Health & Hygiene Workshops:** Reached over 207 children, promoting preventive healthcare
- **Career Counseling:** 158 youth received guidance through assessments and mock sessions
- **Digital Literacy:** 280 youth trained in cybersecurity, internet safety, and online learning tools

Special Events:

Celebrated *Girl Child Day*, *Children's Day*, and *Sports Day*, promoting inclusion, talent, and physical well-being.

B. Bob Doshi Scholarship Project

A scholarship initiative for meritorious but underprivileged youth pursuing higher education.

- **7 scholars supported**
- Reimbursement covered tuition, exams, books, and materials
- Each recipient expressed immense gratitude for support received

Few Scholars' Reflections:

Students like *Shikriti Chakraborty* (KV School of Nursing) and *Trisha Patra* (Women's Polytechnic) noted how this financial support directly contributed to their academic continuity and digital inclusion.

C. Blanket Distribution in Winter

With winter temperatures affecting street-dwellers and impoverished families, Sristy distributed **150+ blankets** in Rajarhat. This intervention, coordinated with Honourable MLA of Rajarhat Newtown, Rajarhat Police, ensured timely delivery to those most in need, restoring dignity and safety during harsh weather.

D. Rogi Sahayata Kendra (RSK)

In partnership with the Government of West Bengal, Sristy managed patient assistance centers at:

- **Murshidabad Medical College**
- **Bhatpara State General Hospital**
- **Sree Balaram Seba Mandir Hospital**
- **Jirangacha Rural Hospital**

Patients benefited from services like admission to hospital support, guidance, Outdoor Ticket, Providing benefit of Swasthya Sathi Card, Ambulance Service, Bridging the gap between Patient and Family etc. significantly reducing waiting times and improving patient care.

E. Other Initiatives

Ahead of **Durga Puja**, Sristy distributed **150+ sarees** to women from economically disadvantaged families. This simple yet meaningful gesture enhanced inclusion and celebration for marginalized communities during the festive season.

Now in its 27th edition, *Sarad Patrika* remains a creative platform celebrating local voices in poetry, storytelling, and cultural reflection. It promotes community cohesion and literary expression, especially among emerging writers and youth contributors.
